Equipment

- * LVS device (avalanche transceiver)
- * Avalanche shovel and probe
- Freeride skis with a minimum of 100mm under the binding
- Freeride boots / Snowboard boots
- o Telescopic poles with large baskets
- ** Avalanche backpack
- o Helmet

You bring that with you

- o Functional underwear
- Short/long-sleeved functional T-shirt
- o Performance socks
- Compact and lightweight insulation jacket, preferably with a hood, with Primaloft or down filling
- o Freeride pants made of softshell/Windstopper
- Windproof jacket with Gore-Tex
- Warm gloves, additionally thin gloves
- o Warm hat, headband, buff
- Sunglasses, ski goggles

Hut accommodation

- Personal medications
- Small microfiber towel
- Toothbrush & toothpaste
- Hut sleeping bag
- Change of clothes, headlamp

High-altitude climbing harness

- * 2 HMS carabiners, 2 standard carabiners
- * 1 ice screw
- * 1 carabiner with triple locking mechanism
- o * Crampons
- * Lightweight ice axe

Food

- o Lightweight thermos bottle for 1L
- o Bars, nuts, chocolate

Your preparation is important to us

Choose functional clothing that efficiently transports moisture to the outside. Apply the layering principle so you can react optimally to temperature fluctuations. Don't pack too much; you'll be amazed at how little you really need. We recommend backpacks with a volume of approximately 30 liters.
